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# No new taxes, projects in Shafter's draft budget

The City Council will be discussing the proposed budget for the 2021-22 fiscal year at its next regular meeting next month.

The budget was prepared following guidelines set by the council on issues that they prioritized for the operating budget. The guidelines were public safety, health and well-being, and financial stability.

The proposed budget reveals a small decrease in sales tax revenue. With the sales tax revenue expected, the city is showing a drop in the amount in the General Fund, going from a balance of a little over \$6.5 mil-

lion in 2021, to a balance of \$6.36 million for the fiscal year of 2021-22.

According to the proposed budget, most of the sales tax revenue was produced by retailer William Sonoma, which has not been as affected as other retailers through the pandemic.

Sales tax revenue represents 62% of the city's revenue, with the projected amount of \$19.3 million in revenue, compared to \$20.5 projected for 2020-21.

The projected expenditures in the different departments are close to the 2020-21 numbers, with a slight increase in the public

safety department.

The Police Department budget was a little over \$6.7 million in 2020-21, with the 2021-22 projected numbers coming in at about \$7.5 million. This increase takes into account new hires that the department has made to strengthen its police force and the new technology that the department has acquired. The Police Department has 41 employees for the coming year which is an increase of six employees.

The total expenditures for 2021-22 is projected to be around \$29.5 million, compared to \$29.1 million in 2020-21. The city will lose the revenue from the Modified


Correctional Facility which is approximately \$1 million. The facility was closed by the state in October 2020.

The proposed budget lists as a goal exploring options to maintain the Shafter Branch Library, attempting to keep it open after the current temporary agreement ends.

The City Council will be discussing the proposed budget at its meeting to be held on Tuesday, June 1, with possible action taken at that time. A copy of the proposed budget can be viewed on the city's website.

A more detailed article on the 2021-22 budget will be in the next issue of the Shafter Press, along with any action taken on the budget.







## Kidd Doh helps children learn while playing

Mother of an autistic son, Brianda Gonzalez was looking for a way to help her son with his cognitive skills as he lagged behind at 2 years old.

Gonzalez, who works at the Golden Oak Elementary School library, came up with Kidd Doh, a product that stimulates a child's senses, encouraging imaginative play and helping motor skills.

When Gonzalez' son, Justin, was 2 years old, she noticed he was lagging behind in cognitive skills and in speech. He was later diagnosed with autism and she began looking for things to help his development.

Gonzalez remembered her mother making play doh for



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# Shafter takes control of Modified Correctional Facility



The city took control of the facility with an agreement with the state Department of Corrections.

The city will take over the Modified Correctional Facility after it came to an agreement with the state Department of Corrections.

Shafter made an agreement with the state in 1996 that gave the state 99 one-year leases. In October 2020, the state closed operations at the facility, resulting in a number of layoffs and a loss in revenue for the city. "We received around \$1 million a year in revenue from the CCF, which hit the city hard with the announcement of the closure," said Mayor Cathy Prout. "We expected the move, but it still was a sad day for the city and its people."

Under the agreement, the closure meant the city would lose the approximately \$1 million in revenue, but would still have to spend about \$120,000 annually to maintain the facility.

With the new agreement, the city is relieved of the expense and is free to explore different uses for the facility. According to Prout, one possibility the city is exploring is the use of a portion for classrooms for Bakersfield College.

"I would like to see us do something with the facility that would produce revenue for the city. We don't know any specific information at the moment, but it would be good for the city to use it to produce income,"

Prout said.

State Sen. Melissa Hurtado helped with the new agreement.

"This was a bipartisan team effort," Hurtado said. "I would like to thank Gov. [Gavin] Newsom and the CDCR, as well as Sen. Shannon Grove for working with my office to return the facility to Shafter. The closures of these facilities throughout the state creates an injustice with vulnerable rural communities losing their jobs and economy along the way. As the state continues to move forward, we must ensure that other injustices are not created. Securing this agreement is one step

toward justice for the city of Shafter."

Prout thanked Hurtado for her efforts in this situation.

"The settlement agreement between the city of Shafter and the CDCR makes it a great day for Shafter. On behalf of the Shafter City Council, we want to thank Senator Hurtado for her support with this endeavor," added Prout.

# Mannel Park Fitness Court now open

The city cut the ribbon at Mannel Park on Saturday, opening up a new outdoor fitness court that will allow residents to work out on a variety of equipment.

The court features over 10 stations that people can do cardio and strengthening exercises and can keep track of their progress on their phones.

The court is a product of Fitness America, who specializes in exercise programs that can be used with a minimal amount of equipment.

Several local dignitaries were on hand including Mayor Cathy Prout, council members Gilbert Alvarado, Pete Espinoza, Cesar Lopez, and Mayor Pro-Tem Chad Givens. Michael James, Public Works director, spoke about the process to build the court.

"The entire project was the result of a federal grant, which means it did not cost the city of Shafter anything," said James. "With the grant, we are also refurbishing the volleyball court, including new sand, net, and poles."

The court has an array of boxes, which

are used to jump up on and step up on, that works the muscles that are involved when walking stairs. There are also painted circles on the cement court, allowing participants to do a cardio workout. There are different styles of pull-up bars, sit-up bars, and other equipment.

A person can get a full workout by hitting all of the different stations in the court.

You can keep track of your progress and learn how to use the equipment by downloading the Fitness Court app for your smartphone.

It will keep track of what equipment you worked on, as well as sample training programs that you can follow.

James told the attendees that the fitness court is just the beginning of the improvements and additions in store for the park. Next up is the refurbishing of the volleyball court, which has started this week, and there will also be improvements to the irrigation system.

The federal grant, made possible by

Proposition 68, is worth a total of a little over \$193,000.

The purchase of the fitness court was \$117,800, with the installation work and consulting a total of \$50,000. The volleyball court improvements, including the sand, came to a total of \$25,400.

# No distance learning offered in fall for high schools

Distance learning will not be an option for students this fall in the Wasco Union High School District.

Superintendent Rob Cobb outlined a number of changes for the 2021-22 school year in a letter to parents and students last week.

Cobb said all students will return to campus for full, five school days a week. Independent study will be offered on a limited basis when necessary.

He explained schools are considered to be

safe places because it has shown to be a low rate of positive cases or transmission. The district will continue with sanitation protocols. The district, Cobb said, anticipates most restrictions will be lifted by the summer. At this time, it is not clear if students and staff will be required to wear masks.

Cobb also said most of the staff has been vaccinated and students may now receive the vaccine and are encouraged to be vaccinated over the summer or prior to the

school year. Vaccination is not required, only recommended, Cobb clarified.

"As covid-19 cases continue to decline, we are ever optimistic that life (and school) will soon return to some semblance of normal," Cobb said. "The Wasco Union High School District has planned for a true in-person summer school and a full return to in-person learning in the fall."

Students will return to campus on Aug. 11 and there will be no distance learning or hybrid schedule option. WUHS plans to offer the vaccine to all high school-aged

students sometime in June.

"Please continue to do your part in curbing the spread of covid-19 and we look forward to seeing all students return to school in August," he added.

Cobb also reminded parents due to the limited capacity, Wasco Independent High graduation will be livestreamed at 9 a.m. on Friday, May 28 and will physically be held on the WHS football field.


Bernal's spring 2021 semester was packed with challenging classes that kept her on her toes.

Outstanding Exhibitor recognition was given to Sheep Mackinley Wankum, Swine Henry Marin Acosta and Goat Ixchel Sanchez.



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

her as a child and she thought this would be a great way to help Justin play, learn and develop. Kidd Doh is soft and pliable, easier to mold than regular play doh and is scented.

"I put different scents in our Kidd Doh, which stimulates the children's sense of smell, as well as sight and touch," said Gonzalez. "It adds something that helps develop their senses and skills."




